
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























Democracy

We should never be treated unfairly because of our age.























UN Rights of a Child

Speaking and Listening

Birth to 5 Matters: Talks about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members. Knows about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families.

Think about: Have you and your family put up decorations before? What were the decorations? Where did you put them up? Inside, outside, living room, kitchen? What are your favourite decorations? Why do you like them so much? Do you enjoy seeing decorations in other places e.g., in shops, supermarkets, streets?

Writing

Can you write a shopping list of what you will need for your party?

Birth to 5 Matters: Starts to develop their phonic knowledge by linking sounds to letters. Uses their developing phonic knowledge to write things such as labels and captions, later progressing to simple sentences.

Discuss that when people organise a party, they need to think carefully about all the things they will need to buy for it. Writing a shopping list can help people to remember what they need when they get to the shops.

Think about: What food will you need for your party? Will you buy some treat food and some healthy food too? What else might you need for the party table? Plates, party hats, something to drink? Will you need any prizes for your games? What will the prizes be?

Resources: Shopping list proforma (see EY Resource 1), pencils, sound mats

Cutting and Sticking

Can you make a model of a house and decorate it?

Birth to 5 Matters: Uses tools for a purpose. Uses their increasing knowledge and understanding of tools and materials to explore their interests and enquiries and develop their thinking.

Recap on this week's news story and discuss that the street are no longer decorating their homes. Challenge the children to make a model of a house each and decorate it to make their own decorated street!

Think about: What will you use to make your house? What kind of house will it be? A bungalow? A detached house? A semidetached? Will it have a garden? What decorations will you add to your house? Will they be on the front/sides/roof of the house or in the garden?

Resources: Junk modelling boxes and materials, coloured card/paper, tape, glue, sequins, scissors, coloured pipe cleaners

Role-play

Can you organise, set up and have your own party?

Birth to 5 Matters: Uses language to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in play situations.

Discuss that often when people put up decorations it's because they are having a party or a celebration.

Think about: What will you need for your party? Will you have food? Will you need

to set a table? Will you put up decorations? Do you need to make some decorations? What kind of decorations will you make? What will you do at your party? Will you play games, dance to music?

Resources: Tables, chairs, music, musical instruments, real or pretend party food, decorations

Maths

Can you colour in the balloons to make some repeated patterns?

Birth to 5 Matters: Chooses familiar objects to create and recreate repeating patterns beyond AB patterns and begins to identify the unit of repeat.

Discuss when people put up balloons to decorate somewhere, sometimes they like to make patterns with the balloons. Look at the patterned balloon cards (see EY Resource 2) and discuss the repeated patterns the children can see and what they think would come next in the sequence.

Think about: Can you make your own repeated pattern with the balloons? Can you tell me your pattern before you colour it? What comes next? I wonder if you could do another repeated pattern with three colours?

Resources: Repeated pattern balloon cards, examples and blanks to colour (see EY Resource 2), colouring pencils or felt tin pens
